The Anglo-Saxons were Germanic invaders from around 600AD. The word Saxon was from the short sword they used ó the seax. It also gave its name to the counties where the Saxons lived: South Saxons in Sussex, West Saxons in Wessex, East Saxons in Essex and of course those in the middle were in Middlesex. You can see three seaxes in the Middlesex and Essex cou
